The rise in energy costs has come on top of financial challenges arising out of closure during the period of the COVID pandemic, as well as continuing public expenditure constraints over many years.

"We hope that our regular swimmers will make an additional visit on that Friday, and many of the community who have not been for a while, but know the important part public leisure plays in the life of the community, will make a special visit. Local political representatives have been invited to come along to meet with Mytime Active management, to hear of the scale of challenge being faced by the community leisure sector.
